The cheer teams cheer during the football games and participate in cheer competitions at the end of the season. Firetree Place hosts banquets for all three teams recognizing their hard work, dedication, and accomplishments throughout the season. In their 2<sup>nd</sup> year during the

fall of 2021, the program has grown by approximately 40 athletes with intentions to continue on this upward trend. The Williamsport Youth Football and Cheer program teaches young boys and girls how to play their respective sport while also providing a safe environment for the youth to learn and grow as individuals.
